FIRE CHIEF

Northeast Fire & Rescue is comprised of three previous fire companies: Good Will Fire Com-

pany of West Fairview, Citizens Fire Company of Enola, and Summerdale Fire Company. Our organization is all-volunteer based and answers between 400-500 emergencies every year. Since the merger of these fire companies, we have downsized our operations from three stations to two. In doing so, we have lowered operating costs and reduced apparatus, all while continuing to provide top-

notch coverage to our district.

Our primary station, located in Summerdale, was built in 1974 and has been outgrown and deteriorating at a rapid pace. The company started planning twelve years ago to replace this station with one that is more modern, operational, and eco-friendly to meet the needs of future firemen for generations to come. After endless amounts of financial & design planning, site visits, and meeting with potential builders, NEFR decided to move forward with a well-established contracting company. On September 14, 2020, the company signed a contract with Conestoga Builders.

Since then, we have struggled with one obstacle after another, including the COVID-19 pandemic. But through it all, we continue to survive and continue to plan for our future. And that future contains replacing our current facility to ensure we can meet the needs and demands of

our community. We are now asking for your help with this major project. Without the help of our community, we will not be able to succeed.

Although our new facility will be larger in size, it is designed to fit within the current landscape

of the area. It will be large enough to house the apparatus needed,

as well as allow ample space to clean and maintain this

apparatus. The building

also includes actual office space and a meeting room to allow members to adequately run the administrative side of the company. Another great aspect of our design is the addition of a bunk room, which would allow firefighters to sleep at the station or live at

the station. The addition of a live-in

program would immensely benefit the community, as having personnel on-site allows for a quicker response to emergencies.

As the fire chief of this awesome organization, I have seen the need for a new facility for several years. Our current facility was built for yesterday. It is what our forefathers and community members were able to build at the time. Over the years, like everything else, our organization has grown to a much larger and fast-paced fire & rescue service. For our all-volunteer organization to continue with its mission of protecting our community, we need your help!

A VISION FOR THE FUTURE.


Our firehouse in Summerdale was built in 1974, and it is deteriorating quickly, as was the old social hall. The ceilings and roof are damaged, cracked, and caving in. Renovations already begun on the social hall because the structure was in such poor condition that it would not have survived another winter.

When the original station was constructed 47 years ago, it was not designed to house modern fire apparatus, let alone all the equipment necessary to protect our community today. Some valuable pieces of equipment must stored outside due to the lack of space in the building and are not protected from the elements. Additionally, the current station does not have a proper ventilation system. Toxic carcinogens coming from the exhaust of the fire apparatus can have detrimental side effects on both our firefighters and their gear. The new building will include a separate room for turnout gear to ensure the exhaust fumes do not soak into the gear itself, thus offering more protection for the firefighters.

Our goal is to build a firehouse that will last for generations to come. We are thinking ahead to set up future firefighters for success - firefighters who will be there for YOU, just like we are to-day.

In 2021, NEFR ran 484 total calls. 55.6% of those calls were local - medical assists, tree down calls, automatic alarms, debris removal, car fires, etc. 22.5% were first alarm fire incidents. 14.7% were auto accidents.

Members of NEFR dedicated a total of 2,571.89 hours to answering the bell in 2021 and averaged 8.5 members per call. In addition to going on fire calls, NEFR's members put in 1,022 hours of training last year.




